

St. Martin's Church, Dorking

Welcome to this Church which is shared by Anglicans and Methodists. For more than 1,000 years Christians have worshipped on this site in the centre of our busy market town. This Church is the fourth one on the site (the first was recorded in the Domesday Survey) and was completed, with its 200 ft. spire, in 1877. Together with the adjacent Christian Centre as a place of wider outreach into the Community, St. Martin's provides a Christian witness at the heart of the town – a venue for quiet personal reflection and prayer as much as for the formal civic service or a lively end of term service with our linked Church primary school. With its fine organ it is much in demand as a venue for concerts, and there is a strong choral tradition underpinning much of our worship. We hope you will find here a place of peace and beauty at this festive time. The Church is named after St. Martin of Tours (see below).

St Martin of Tours

Martin was born in 316 AD in Savaria in Hungary. His Father was a senior officer in a unit of the Roman army. Christianity had been made a legal religion (in 313) in the Roman Empire and at the age of 10 he attended the Christian Church against the wishes of his parents. Conscripted as a soldier into the Roman army, he found the duty incompatible with the Christian faith he had adopted and became an early conscientious objector. Martin was eventually released from military service, declared his vocation, and made his way to the city of Tours where he became a disciple of Hilary of Poitiers, Bishop of Tours. Hilary helped Martin to found a monastery at Marmoutiers on the opposite shore of the Loire. In 371 AD Martin himself succeeded Hilary as Bishop of Tours. As Bishop he enthusiastically ordered the destruction of pagan temples, altars and sculptures. He himself withdrew from the city to live in Marmoutier, the monastery he had founded. Martin was particularly dedicated to the freeing of prisoners and was against the then common practice of executing Heretics so that when authorities, even Emperors, heard he was coming they refused to see him because they knew he would request mercy for someone and they would be unable to refuse.

The best known legend of St.Martin relates to his time as a soldier in the Roman army when stationed in Gaul. One day as he was approaching the gates of the city of Amiens he met a scantily clad beggar. He impulsively cut his military cloak in half to share with the man. That night, Martin dreamed of Jesus wearing the half-cloak he had given away. The dream confirmed Martin in his piety. The part of the cloak kept by himself became a famous relic preserved in the oratory of Marmoutier Abbey. Martin died of natural causes in 397 AD.

The veneration of Martin was widely popular in the Middle Ages. He is the Patron Saint of beggars, wool-weavers and tailors (because of sharing his cloak), soldiers, vintners and innkeepers (because his feast falls just after the late grape harvest).

Surrey Cantata, conducted by Sebastian Forbes

Surrey Cantata was formed by **Sebastian Forbes** in May 2008, as an ad hoc vocal ensemble for singing concerts and Church services. Prominent in the choir's short history are their annual tours to Brittany - three concerts each July - and regular appearances in Guildford's two biennial music festivals. Surrey Cantata sings at various Church services, most regularly at Southwark Cathedral where they have annually sung at a Sunday Eucharist and Evensong. Smaller forces often sing at special services such as weddings and funerals, in particular at the Churches of East and West Clandon where Sebastian Forbes is organist.

Organist: Matthew Rickard

Matthew Rickard studied at the University of Surrey and the Royal Academy of Music, and has a busy performing career as both chamber musician and soloist. He has recorded several CDs with the violinist Rupert Marshall-Luck for the EM Records label, which have been featured on BBC Radio 3, BBC Four, and many other radio stations around the World. He is Organist at St. Peter's Church in Old Woking, where he also runs a professional recital series.

Narrators: Rosie Wood, Maurice Dawes

Rosie Wood and Maurice Dawes are members of the congregation at St. Peter and St. Paul, West Clandon. Each enjoys a busy life with a large family. In addition Rosie is active in voluntary work, including being a Governor at two local prep. schools, whilst Maurice is a Chartered Accountant and has been a Church Reader since the late 1960s, when he was Church Warden in West Sussex.
